1. Principal's Sharing

Dear parents and students.

The 2024-2025 academic year is a fruitful year for our school. Since last summer, more than 850 students from other schools have applied to enroll in our school. Unfortunately, our school is full and nearly 90% of applicants cannot enroll in our school. For this reason, I have formally applied to the Education Bureau to open extra classes, in order not to disappoint every student.

In terms of exchanges with the mainland and foreign countries, our school has a very broad range of contacts. On **November 27**, our school contacted WOLGWANG CHIRSTIAN SCHOOL in Seoul through the Northeast Asian History Foundation. On that day, 21 students aged 12-14 visited the school and talked with our Form 3 students about the differences in study and life in the two schools. Korean students practiced bowing in front of the statue of Confucius. Teachers from the two schools exchanged their experiences in promoting moral education and Chinese history classes. Our school is planning to visit the sister school in Seoul in June.

On **December 12**, our school was invited by Hong Kong Ta Kung Wen Wei Media Group to perform the opening performance and etiquette work of the "Touching Hong Kong 2024 Awards Ceremony". 22 students sang "Below the Lion Rock". The ceremony praised 10 outstanding social figures, including senior artists, athletes, social welfare, and medical talents. Their spirit of valuing righteousness and compassion is a good learning material for students. In addition, 10 students served as etiquette work, and the guests praised the students for their modesty and decent performance.

On **December 13**, the 61st Annual Graduation and Awards Ceremony was held. Professor He Qiliang, Dean of Hong Kong Shue Yan University, presented the certificates, and the Chancellor and a group of school directors presented awards. Also, the live orchestra performance was lively.

From **December 14 to 18**, about 40 teachers and students flew directly from Shenzhen Airport to Weihai. In addition to exchanging teaching experiences with Huancui International Middle school, our school was kindly welcomed by the local government there. The Shandong Provincial United Front Work Department and the Central Publicity Department both sent senior

officials to meet with teachers and students, and hosted a dinner for the teachers. They toured Liu Gong Island and the Jiawu War Memorial with the students. The classmates were filled with mixed feelings, reflecting on how China's achievements are today. After returning to Hong Kong, the students shared their thoughts during the morning assembly.

From **January 6-10**, our school visited Jinan and formed alliances with Gangcheng School and Quanjing Middle School. On the day of the alliance with Quanjing Middle School, both the Minister of the Central Publicity Department and the Deputy Minister of the United Front Work Department attended the ceremony, which left us feeling honored.

On **January 20**, the Chinese Culture Week began, featuring a presentation of Chinese music and inviting a professor from Baptist University to give a lecture. On January 21, Viu TV came to the school to film a special feature, selecting unique schools for the shoot, and our school was one of them. The television station specifically filmed the school's Li Kong ceremony.

On **January 23**, as part of the "2024/25 Ethnic-Friendly Campus Recognition Program," 99 volunteer students from higher education institutions held multicultural workshops at our school, engaging in deep conversations with non-Chinese students. Students designed spring couplets, conducted workshops, and set up food stalls to serve primary and college students. Cooking Mama prepared traditional festive cakes and turnip cakes, filling the campus with a lively holiday atmosphere.

On **February 22**, "The Ordinary Chamber" and Academy of Innovation (Confucius Hall) co-hosted the FANTASY BEETHOVEN concert. Thirty artists from four regional choirs, along with 50 singers, created a spectacular performance. The thrilling melodies and timeless stage charm rivaled that of European opera houses, highlighting the architectural features of Confucius Hall. The wisdom of artisans from 90 years ago was on full display, and the audience of 300 erupted in continuous applause, leading to a surge of 1,800 views on the school's Facebook page over two days.

On **March 25**, the YC Girls Impact Foundation (JYCGIF) held the "Tomorrow's Female Leaders Summit 2024/2025" with a special lecture and sharing session titled "The Future World of Work: How Does It Impact You Now?" The event featured heavyweight guests: Tsai Wai-kit from Cyberport, San Wong, founder of the well-known startup R2C2, and Billy Hui from LURRY AI TRAINING at the Hong Kong Science Park. They shared their entrepreneurial journeys with F.3 and 4 students. An AI robot also roamed the auditorium, and students eagerly asked questions about research and development, creating a lively interactive atmosphere.

From **March 24-28**, during English Week, featuring a lively array of activities including a spelling competition, game booths, a singing contest, and role-playing. The event was very energetic and vibrant.

On **March 28**, Ms. Yang Lulu, an associate professor from the School of Music at Guizhou University, and Mr. Zhang Lizhi from the Design Department of Guiyang Academy of Fine Arts visited the school to share their insights on the path to success.

On **March 29**, "The Ordinary Chamber" and Academy of Innovation (Confucius Hall) co-hosted the concert "Dual Rhythms: Mozart." Thirty talented musicians delivered an extraordinary performance of Mozart's works. Ms. Yang Lulu, an associate professor from

Guizhou University, collaborated with Jacky Lee for a stunning duet, attended by 150 audience members.

On **March 29**, the Confucius Poon Choi lunch was held, featuring 15 tables with alumni, parents, teachers and students gathering, with the Guzheng and singing performances by our students.

On **April 2**, the Jockey Club's "Adventure-Ship" training took place. From **April 2-3**, a day camp sponsored by The Warehouse Teenage Club with the theme "The Disappearing Castle Master," where students participated in escape room activities and adventure challenges. Working within a time limit, students collaborated at different stations to complete various tasks, including handcrafts, graffiti, instrument playing, and exploring historical artifacts. Through these activities, they collected clues about the castle master's daily life, interests, career development, and social life. Guided by instructors, students shared their experiences and deductions, creating a missing person notice to be posted in the center, setting the stage for future activities.

Regarding public competitions, on **December 1**, Mr. Chan Hing-sing from the Career Guidance Team and Ms. Lau Tsz-lok from the Visual Arts Department meticulously planned a cross-subjects collaboration to participate in a short film competition organized by the Education Bureau and the Hong Kong Logistics Association.

Students from F.3, Yau Cheuk-hong, Leung Shing-fung, Chan Ching-yuen, Lyu Meng-xuan, and Li Ming-yan produced the short film "Logistics in an Instant." The team attended training sessions organized by the association, with the school hiring instructors for additional training. Students took the lead in data collection, performance, field research, editing, and sound recording. The competition clip was published on YouTube, winning the "Top Ten Videos" and "Best Mentor" awards, along with a cash prize of HKD 10,000.

On **February 12**, the school participated in the Hong Kong Broadcasting Corporation's Media Experience Training for F.3-4 and made it to the final eight. On **March 28**, at the "Media Multi-Experience" awards ceremony, the students faced eight challenging tasks. Producer Siu Lung and the production team praised the students for their perseverance. Despite encountering numerous obstacles during outdoor filming, the five participating students remained calm and worked together to overcome difficulties, although they noted that their interviewing skills still needed improvement.

The school participated in a territory-wide Mathematics competition with over 7,000 participants. A total of 21 students from our school qualified, achieving notable rankings: one student placed 22nd overall, three ranked in the top 10%, three within the top 25%, and 14 within the top 50%. Additionally, four students participated in other Mathematics competitions and qualified for the finals, which will be held in Japan, with the school sending teachers to accompany them.

Our school has become a well-known school in China and is gaining a strong reputation in Hong Kong. I hope that our students continue to excel in both behavior and academic performance.

3.9 **"HuaXia Cup" National Mathematics Olympic Invitation Competition 2025**

Five junior form students from our school participated in the "HuaXia Cup" National Mathematics Olympic Invitation Competition 2025. All five students advanced to the qualifying round, they are 1B Zheng Dragon, 1B Zhang Kam Ham, 3A Cao Jessica, 3B Wu Zhuo Lin and 3B Liu Royal. School News

4.1 **Adjustments to Tuition Fees in 2025-2026 (To be confirmed by EDB)**

The fees are subject to change upon Education Bureau's approval :

- HK\$5,670 annually in ten installments (HK\$567 monthly) for S.1 students
- HK\$5,670 annually in ten installments (HK\$567 monthly) for S.2 students
- HK\$5,670 annually in ten installments (HK\$567 monthly) for S.3 students
- HK\$5,670 annually in ten installments (HK\$567 monthly) for S.4 students
- HK\$5,670 annually in ten installments (HK\$567 monthly) for S.5 students
- HK\$5,670 annually in ten installments (HK\$567 monthly) for S.6 students
- The adjustments of tuition fees are subject to students' admission to our school for the year.
- The tuition fees from October 2025 to June 2026 should be settled via direct debit from banks. The transaction is scheduled for the first working day of each month. The Direct Debit Authorization Form should be completed and returned to the Class Teacher for handling.
- **For security reasons, starting from September 2025, parents are required to pay tuition by bank autopay or cheque.**

4.2 PE Uniform Rules in School

Students are prohibited from wearing PE uniforms on days without PE lessons. Students violating the rule may be demanded to return home to get changed before they are allowed to enter the school.
